Parents, you can help at home too! Try testing your child on their times tables at dinner, on the way to school, or during a spare moment in the day. Every bit of practice builds their confidence, and together, we can ensure that times tables remain a real strength at Lordship Lane!

Through engaging and interactive lessons, they have explored:


What it means to be an entrepreneur

#### **Why Attendance Matters**

We're making great strides, but we still need to keep pushing to raise our overall school attendance. Every single day in school matters, and even missing a few days can have a big impact on learning.

Here's a guick reminder of how absences add up:

- **✓ 100% attendance** = 0 days missed
- **№** 95% attendance = Nearly 10 days missed a year
- 90% attendance = Almost 4 weeks of missed learning
- 80% attendance = Nearly 8 weeks missed—almost an entire term!

Let's work together to **get our whole school above 95%!**
