Post Title: EYFS Afterschool Club Key Worker (Reception and Nursery)

Grade: SC5

Contract: Fixed-term (1 year)

Hours: Monday to Friday, 3:30 PM – 6:00 PM (12.5 hours/week, term-time only)

Purpose:

The EYFS Afterschool Club Key Worker will lead wrap-around care for Reception and Nursery children, ensuring their development, safety, and well-being in a nurturing, play-based environment aligned with the EYFS framework. The postholder will act as the designated key worker for these year groups, liaising with parents and colleagues to support continuity of care between school and wraparound provision.

Key Accountabilities:

- Ensure the safe arrival of children and secure handover to carers at the end of the day
- Plan and deliver safe, creative, and developmentally appropriate activities aligned with EYFS principles
- Act as key worker for Reception and Nursery children, supporting their individual development and care
- Liaise with teaching staff to support continuity between school and afterschool settings
- Maintain daily risk assessments and ensure a safe environment at all times
- Prepare and serve snacks, adhering to hygiene and safety protocols
- Administer and record first aid as appropriate
- Set up and tidy the space each day, maintaining a welcoming and stimulating environment
- Support with display and celebration of children's work in the afterschool club space
- Positively manage behaviour using appropriate strategies and policies
- Maintain confidentiality and uphold the policies and values of the school
- Ensure pupil ratios are maintained in line with statutory guidance
- Keep simple observations or notes as needed to support children's transitions and care
- Establish warm, professional relationships with parents and staff

- Demonstrate a personal commitment to safeguarding and wellbeing
- Report concerns or incidents in line with the school's safeguarding policy
- Engage in safeguarding training and professional development
